Varsity volleyball competed at the McBain Varsity Fall Classic on Saturday October 15<sup>th</sup>. After competing with 4 teams in pool play, the Lady Chemics were seeded 6th out of 13 teams. In bracket play, they lost to third seed Kingsley. Olivia McMath delivered 38 kills, 29 assists, 34 digs, and 7 aces, while Jenna Rekeweg added 40 assists, 15 digs, 10 kills, and 8 aces. Nicole Giardina contributed 14 kills, Emmalea TerBurgh added 13 kills and 6 blocks, Brooklyn Foster pounded 8 kills and 7 blocks, and Brooke Russell added 6 blocks and 5 kills. Defensively, Grace Schloop had 39 digs, Emma Buschlen had 26 digs, and Ellie Stevens had 16 digs. The Chemic's Volleyball program goes to Bay City Central for pink out night on Tuesday Oct. 18th.

Your Chemic girls' cross-country team finished in 3rd place this past Saturday at the Freeland Invitational. In the varsity race, Midland claimed third place with all seven of the varsity runners finishing within a minute of each other. Top runners for the Chemics included Grace Riddle, Chloe Greer, Rachel Mecca, and Ava Kontranowski. Liv Rohr earned a new lifetime personal best time and was Midland's final varsity point scorer. The Chemics tied for second place in the reserve race with Sawyer Collins earning a new lifetime personal best time to finish in 5th place. Other point scorers included Sophia Knarr, Cara Bucci, Laura Brookens, and Reagan Vokal.

In an impressive show of team depth, your Chemic boys' cross-country team had all seven varsity runners medal and finish within a minute of each other to capture 4th place at the Freeland Invitational. Andrew Worsley, Logan Bellinger, Matthew Berg, Aiden Porrit, and Jacob Leff were the point scorers for Midland. As they have for much of the year, Midland's JV team dominated the reserve race to earn their second team title in a row. Lucas Berg was the JV race champion followed by fellow point scorers Jacob Rudisel, Mateo Reyes, Landon Ferren, and Caleb Brown.

The varsity football team improved their record to 7-1 with a 28-6 win up in Marquette on Friday. Mason Weaver rushed for 82 yards and 2 touchdowns. Jalen Brown had 93 yards and a touchdown. Hudosn Gerstacker had a punt return for a touchdown to complete the scoring for the Chemics. Noah Wall, Gabe Malace, Merrick Hocking, Brown, and Gerstacker led the Chemics defense. Wall and Hocking both had interceptions. The Chemics host Dow this Friday.
