I thought about all the things any parent would think of. "Why is this happening", "This sucks", "Should be me, not her"....and Skylar says, "It is what it is". Calm like a cucumber. She is strong, there's no doubt about that. Skylar's kindergarten teacher came for a visit and brought goodies. She just celebrated her 10-year anniversary of being cancer-free. During the visit she said, "You got this, Skylar. Cancer's not for wimps." She wasn't kidding.
