It was enacted into law on August 17, 1988, on the approval of Public Law 100-402.

The Midland High boys' varsity cross-country team finished in 4th place at Saturday's Heritage Invitational. Andrew Worsley, Lucas Berg, Ben Bucci, Logan Bellinger, and Aiden Porritt all finished in the top 30 out of over 100 runners to earn points for the Chemics. The JV boys dominated the reserve race by sweeping the top five positions to score a perfect 15 points and capture the reserve race title. Landon Ferren was the reserve race champion with Jacob Rudisel, Caleb Brown, Drew Thornton, and Ethan Klaffer completing the top 5 places.

The Chemic girls' cross-country team captured third place in the varsity race at the Heritage Invitational this past Saturday. Grace Riddle led Midland with an 8th-place finish. Chloe Greer and Rachel Mecca finished in the top 20 with Ava Kontranowski and Avery Shepard rounding out the point scorers for Midland. The JV team finished in second place in the reserve race.
