Today, March 8th is International Women's Day! The reason why we celebrate this day is to commemorate the cultural, political, and socioeconomic achievements of women. With that said today we are celebrating Maya Angelou. In the 1940s, Maya Angelou became the first Black female streetcar conductor in San Francisco, California. During the 1960s she became heavily involved in the Civil Rights Movement. Her 1969 autobiography, "I Know Why The Caged Bird Sings," is the first nonfiction bestseller written by an African American woman. Maya Angelou recited one of her poems at President Bill Clinton's 1993 inaugural ceremony — marking the first inaugural recitation since 1961. She also was lauded in 1995 for her record-setting, two-year run on The New York Times' paperback nonfiction bestseller list. She was also the first African American woman to have her screenplay produced, for the 1972 film "Georgia, Georgia." Maya Angelou continues to have a lasting legacy through her incredible poems and other works.
