Last night the JV Volleyball team battled Lapeer on their home court. After dropping the first two sets, they gained some major momentum to go on and win the third 15-12. Lila Rekeweg had 5 kills and 3 blocks. Addi Sullivan had 6 digs and 15 serve receptions. Cam Mackezyk ended the night with 6 assists and 2 kills. Go Chemics!

Midland High Girls' Varsity volleyball suffered a home loss on senior night, October 13<sup>th</sup>, to Lapeer. The Chemics lost set 1, 22-25, and won set 2, 25-16, before falling to the Lightning in games 3 and 4, 18-25 and 22-25.
